Introduction

The importance of understanding the Holy Spirit:

- The Holy Spirit is a person, not an impersonal force (John 16:7).
- He is the Spirit of Jesus, and is essential for our relationship with God.

Key scripture: John 16:7 – Jesus promises the Holy Spirit as a Helper and Advocate.

1: Who He Is

The Person of the Holy Spirit: (John 14:16; 1 John 2:1)

- He has a mind, will, and emotions.
- His names and roles: Helper, Counselor, Advocate, Comforter, and Friend .

A Relationship with Jesus: John 14:16

- The Spirit is "another Helper" (Greek: allos another of the same kind).
- He is with us like Jesus was with the disciples but in a deeper, indwelling way.

2: His Power and Filling

Empowerment for Witnessing: Acts 1:4-8

- Jesus commanded the disciples to wait for the Holy Spirit before ministering.
- The Spirit's infilling provides boldness and power to spread the Gospel.
