Underfoot 3 - The Defeat of Sin



Introduction: Jesus' Victory and Our Ongoing Role

Jesus defeated **Satan, sin, and death**, but the **church is called to apply that victory** (Matthew 24). Misunderstanding the "already but not yet" nature of this victory leads to confusion about the presence of evil in the world. The goal: Understand **what Jesus has done** and **what we must still do**.

Point 1: God's Original Design and the Fall

- **Genesis 1-3, Psalm 8**: Humanity was created to have dominion and extend God's order over the earth.
- The Fall introduced Satan, sin, and death into the picture through deception and disobedience.
 - Satan lied and undermined God's goodness.
 - Sin entered through human choice to disobey God.
 - Death followed as the natural and spiritual consequence.

Point 2: Jesus' Victory Over Sin

- **Hebrews 2**: Jesus became human to defeat sin, Satan, and death.
- Mark 1:21, Matthew 1:21: Jesus came to save us from sin, not just forgive it.
- What He did:
 - Jesus lived a sinless life—a model for overcoming temptation (Hebrews 4:15).
 - **He forgave sin** and inspired righteousness in others (e.g., John 8 the woman caught in adultery).
 - **He linked forgiveness with healing**, showing the integrated nature of sin, sickness, and spiritual brokenness (Mark 2:9–11).

Point 3: The Three Aspects of Sin Jesus Defeated

- Penalty of Sin
 - Jesus bore our griefs and punishment (Isaiah 53:4–5).
 - Romans 4:5–8: Righteousness is credited through faith, not works.
 - Jesus became our substitute—He paid the full price once and for all (Hebrews 10:14).
- Power of Sin
 - Sin enslaves through guilt, separation from God, trained behavior (the flesh), and demonic influence.
 - Romans 6:1–6: Believers are united with Christ in His death and resurrection; our "old self" is crucified. The power of sin is destroyed Rom 6:6
 - Four powers broken:
 - 1. **Guilt** Removed through forgiveness.
 - 2. **Separation from God** Restored relationship through the Spirit.
 - 3. Flesh (habitual sin) Crucified with Christ.
 - 4. **Devil's power** Defeated; his only tool now is deception.
- Presence of Sin
 - Though the power and penalty are broken, the presence of sin remains in our mortal hodies
 - Romans 6:11–13, Romans 8:1–6:
 - We must "reckon ourselves dead to sin."

- We are to set our minds on the Spirit, not the flesh.
- Sin remains in the world, but we are not its slaves.

Point 4: Living in Ongoing Victory

- We are in a "now and not yet" tension—the battle is won, but the enemy still resists.
- 1 John 1:8–9; 3:6–9: Ongoing tension between our spiritual nature and earthly bodies. Sin remains with us BUT we must be becoming more and more like Jesus in righteous behaviour..
- Victory involves daily participation:
 - Believing the truth about Christ's work.
 - Resisting the devil through Scripture and faith (James 4:7).
 - Walking in the Spirit and choosing righteousness.

Conclusion & Life Applications

- Acknowledge the reality: We still see evil, sin, and death, but Jesus has rendered them powerless.
- Rest in His complete forgiveness there is now no condemnation (Rom 8:1)
- Jesus has done the work, but we must walk it out:
 - Resist the devil: Recognize and reject lies.
 - Reckon yourself dead to sin: Set your mind on things of the Spirit.
 - Walk in victory: You are forgiven, empowered, and secure in Christ.

Rom 3:19 NKJV - "19 Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God."

Gal 3:19, 23-24 NKJV - "19 What purpose then does the law serve? It was added because of transgressions, till the Seed should come to whom the promise was made; and it was appointed through angels by the hand of a mediator. ... 23 But before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed. 24 Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith."

Heb 7:27, 9:12, 25-28, 10:10 NKJV - "27 who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself."

Heb 9:12, 25-28 - "12 Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption. ... 25 not that He should offer Himself often, as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood of another-- 26 He then would have had to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now, once at the end of the ages, He has appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself. 27 And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment, 28 so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation."

Heb 10:10 - "10 By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all."

Rom 6:1-3, 5-6 NKJV - "1 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? 2 Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it? 3 Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? ... 5 For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in

the likeness of His resurrection, 6 knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin."

Rom 6:11-13 NKJV - "11 Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord. 12 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts. 13 And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God."

Rom 8:2, 5-6 NKJV - "2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death. ... 5 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. 6 For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace."

1Jo 1:8 NKJV - "8 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

1Jo 1:9 NKJV - "9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

1Jo 5:18 NIV - "18 We know that anyone born of God does not continue to sin; the One who was born of God keeps them safe, and the evil one cannot harm them."
