Jesus' Human Lifeblood



Introduction

- *Key Text:* **1 Peter 1:18–19** Redeemed by the **precious blood of Christ**.
- The blood of Jesus is central to Christianity but often overlooked.

Point 1: The Story of Blood in the Bible

- Genesis 3:21 First sacrifice when God clothed Adam & Eve.
- Genesis 4:3-10 Abel's blood sacrifice accepted; his blood cried out.
- **Exodus 12** Passover lamb's blood protected Israel.
- Old Testament sacrifices pointed to the need for a final Savior.
- John 1:29 Jesus announced as the Lamb of God.

Point 2: Why It Had to Be Human Blood

- Sin is against **God Himself**—either we pay or **God must pay**.
- Animal sacrifices could never remove sin properly (**Hebrews 10**).
- Only God becoming **fully human** could offer the perfect sacrifice.
- Philippians 2:6–8 Jesus humbled Himself, took human form, died on the cross.

Point 3: Jesus' Humanity and Suffering for Us

- He lived a full human life: poverty, work, rejection, temptation (Luke 2:52, Hebrews 5:8).
- Depended on the Father and Spirit for miracles (John 5:19, Luke 4:18).
- Suffered intensely: Gethsemane (Luke 22:44), beaten, crucified, pierced (John 19:34).
- Declared "It is finished" (John 19:30) debt paid in full.
- His human blood makes Him our relatable High Priest (**Hebrews 4:15**).

Conclusion & Life Application

- Hebrews 2:14 Jesus shared flesh and blood to destroy death's power.
- Because of His blood:
 - We are forgiven and redeemed.
 - We can face trials knowing He understands.
 - We are called to **follow His example** in prayer, obedience, and Spirit-filled living.
 - We live with hope in resurrection and eternity.
- Call: Apply the blood to your life as Israel did at Passover—trust in Christ's finished work.
